My name is Nicole Sieving. I am a wife, a mother of three, a tax paying, and law-abiding citizen of this community. I would like to thank the School Board for the opportunity to express my concerns. These are shared concerns among a coalition of Eastwood parents doing research, speaking with attorneys, and gathering information from parents in many surrounding districts.

For far too long we have sat idly by while bureaucrats that have no business dictating anything in our communities, have acted as if they have that right! Well, NO More! We are taking back our community!

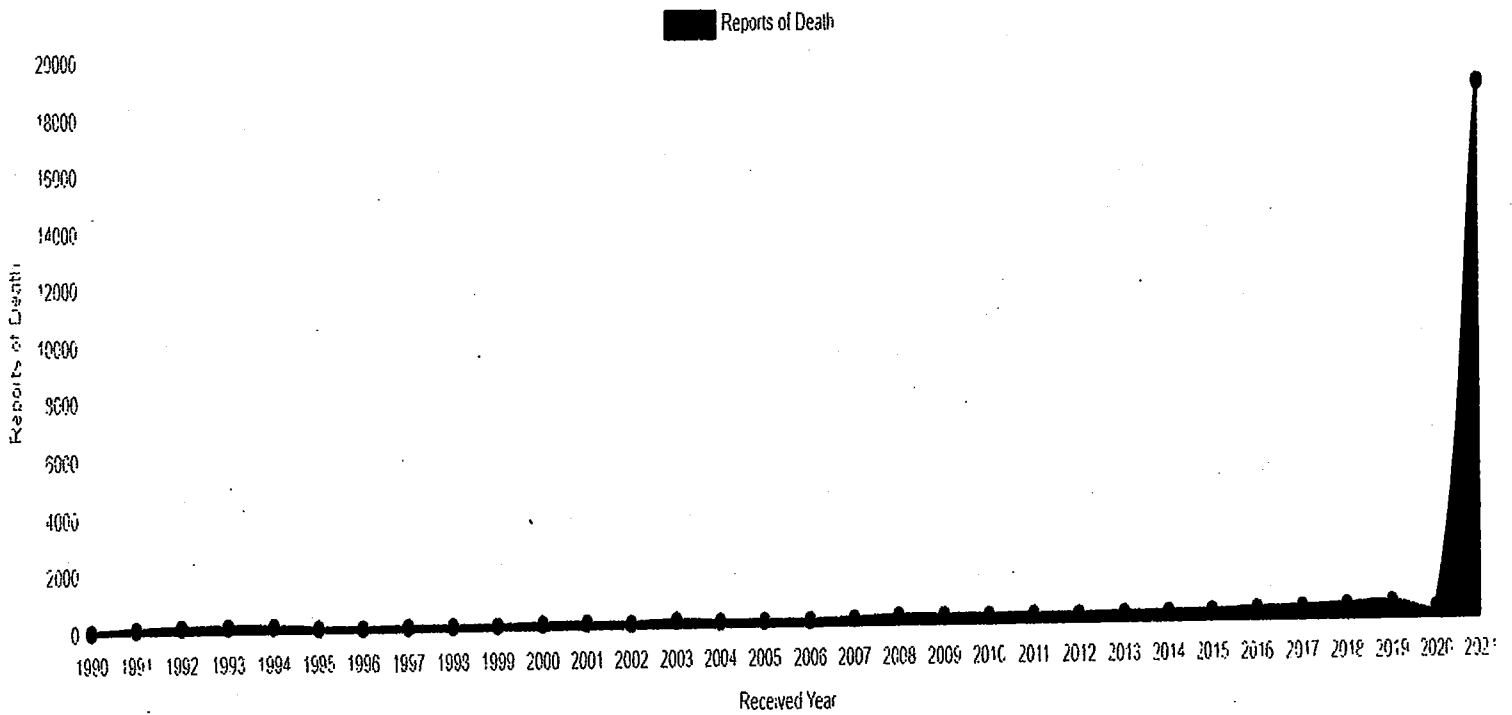

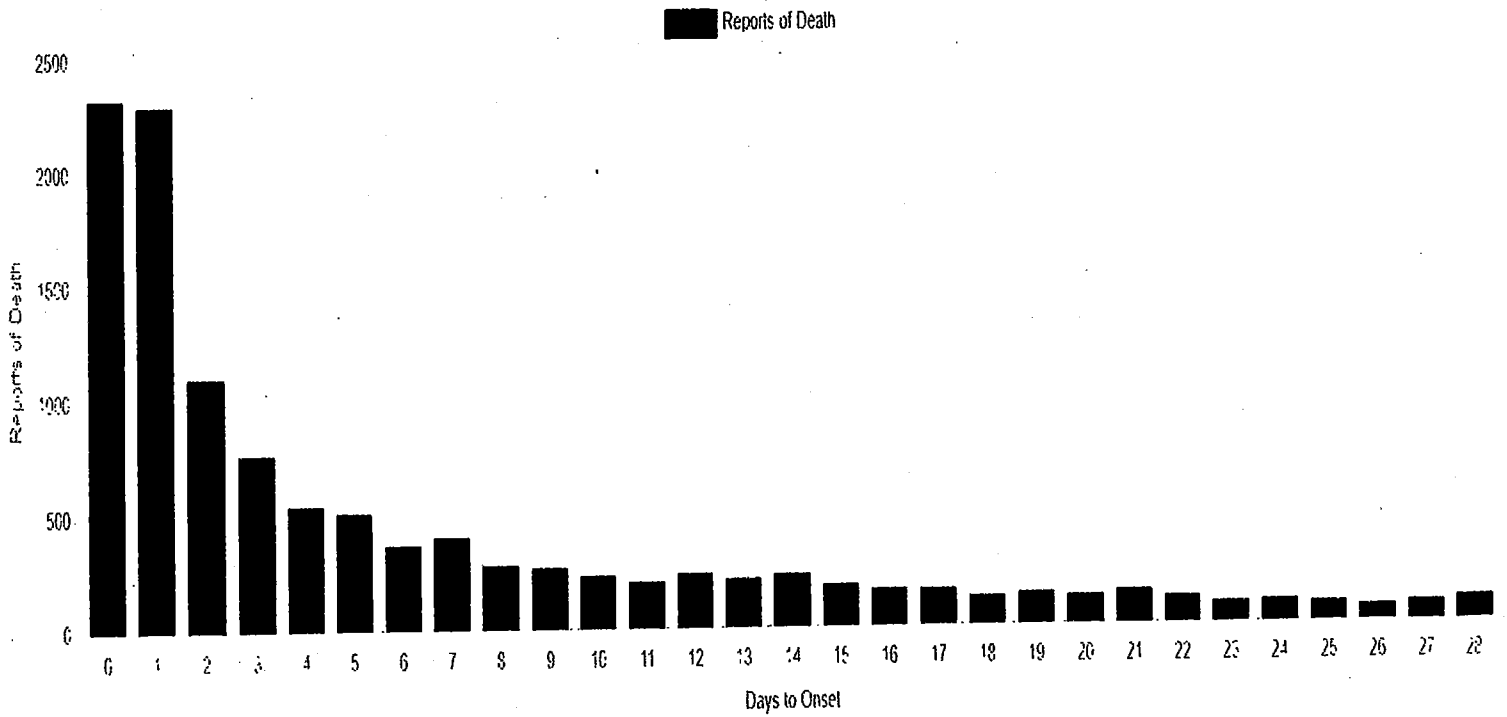
